





James R. Bairstow Founder of Bairstow Studio

In 1873,
James R. Bairstow
opened the Bairstow Studio
at 340 Water Street in Warren.

During the Spanish-American War,
David F. Bairstow entered the photographic
business with his father James.

In 1917, during WWI, the studio was moved to 219 Liberty Street in Warren.

In 1961,

David F. Bairstow passed the family business on to his son James Robert Bairstow.
