


This post card is addressed to

sons Herman Moll and John Moll and husband T. T. Moll.
The post card is dated Feb. 7, 1912.
T. T. Moll's business, located in Russell, PA.,
dealt in hides, pelts, and tallow.

Covered Bridge Over the Conewango at Russell, PA.
First Built 1827—1828
Rebuilt — 1840



The Conewango Refining Company was built in North Warren, bordering Conewango Creek and alongside the D. A. V. & P. Railroad.

Operations started in December 1877

with the capacity to produce 1,000 barrels a week.

The Conewango Refining Company fire occurred May 7, 1923.


